### Dear CMH Member:

We invite you to attend the 66th annual meeting of the Company of Military Historians in historic Richmond, Virginia. We are convinced you come to Company meetings because you get opportunities to see and do things you cannot get in any other venue . . . and we have loaded this conference with events that are unique to the Company meeting:

- Presentations on several significant civil war battles and events that occurred in the central Virginia theatre of operations.
- Two half-day field trips to visit the Civil War battlefield sites of the Seven Days battles and the Siege of Petersburg.
- Visit two museums on U.S. Army post Fort Lee that depict the history and heritage of the Army's Quartermaster Corps and logistics, and the women who have served in the U.S. Army.
- Optional Field Trip One (pre-meeting) full day battlefield trip on the Victory at Yorktown that will cover a number of battle sites in the Yorktown area. Full details are included in this registration packet.
- Optional Field Trip Two (post-meeting) full day trip covering the retreat from Petersburg to Appomattox with visits to three museums followed by a tour and dinner at Haw Branch Plantation, a historic restored eighteenth century Virginia plantation home. Full details are included herein.

### Additional highlights include:

- Ample exhibit display/flea market space. Round-the-clock security coverage provided by professional security guards.
- Continental breakfasts, beverages, and lunches included so you can attend all of the lectures without being hurried to look for places to eat.

We have worked hard to bring you a conference adapted to provide you with the kind of experience you expect and, despite holding the meeting in a major urban area, keep prices at a reasonable level while providing two high quality field trips to accompany the lecture series.

In addition to providing the two field trips and the traditional Saturday banquet, the registration fee includes Friday and Saturday (light continental) breakfasts, a sit down plated lunch on Friday and a boxed lunch on Saturday.

Full Registration Rate for the three-day meeting is \$225.

Optional Full Day Pre-meeting Field Trip to Yorktown is \$145.

Optional Full Day Post-meeting Field Trip to Appomattox sites and eighteenth century Haw Branch Plantation is \$110.

There are numerous other activities and sites within the greater Richmond area if you wish to extend your visit with us either before and/or after our meeting. Popular sites within walking distance of our host Omni Hotel include twenty restaurants, the Thomas Jefferson designed Capitol building, NPS Visitors Center at the Tredegar Iron Works, the American Civil War Center at Historic Tredegar, and the Museum of the Confederacy. There is ample parking in the underground parking deck located beneath the hotel. The meeting rooms are large, convenient and immediately adjacent to the room where members may set up their military history themed displays. The Flea Market area is located in a separate adjacent area so displays and sales tables will not be commingled or confusing to our meeting attendees.

We have negotiated a special hotel room rate at the Omni of \$139 plus tax, and there is no surcharge for having two people in a room. Note: to receive this rate and room guarantee you MUST register with the hotel no later than May 6, 2015, as rooms will only be held for us by the hotel until May 6th (please reserve your room early).

Enjoy a relaxing day leaving the City of Richmond heading west to follow the troop movements from the breakout from the siege of Petersburg to the surrender at Appomattox. This tour will visit 3 museums (Sailor's Creek, the Museum of the Confederacy's new museum at Appomattox, and the Appomattox Courthouse National Historic Park. Boxed lunches will be provided on the trip towards Appomattox and on the return you will travel to Haw Branch Plantation for a tour of a privately owned 18<sup>th</sup> century plantation residence. Tours of the historic residence and a southern style "Sunday Supper" will be served on the magnificent back porch of the "big house" before returning to the Omni Hotel in Richmond. The tour includes a morning snack, boxed lunch, and Sunday supper, Museum admission fees, research folder, and the services of Les Jensen, past CMH President who will lead the tour, and David Cardona, resident and owner of Haw Branch Plantation.

# Victory at Yorktown: Pre-meeting Bus Tour

Thursday, May 28, 8 a.m.—5 p.m. Leaving from the Richmond Omni Hotel



America's History's fifth tour for the Company of Military Historians will focus on Virginia's major Revolutionary War campaign: General George Washington's victory over Lt. Gen. Charles Lord Cornwallis's British army at Yorktown in October 1781. We have enlisted an award-winning author and historian as part of our tour team. Edward G. Lengel is editor-in-chief of the *Papers of George Washington Project* at the University of Virginia and

author of three books on Washington, including the highly acclaimed *General George Washington: A Military Biography*. He will be joined by Bill Welsch, an author and popular Revolutionary War tour leader; some members will remember Bill as the leader our Trenton tour in 2011. Bruce Venter, president of America's History, LLC, a Company member and author of *The Battle of Hubbardton: The Rear Guard Action that Saved America* (2015) will provide the British side of the story.

This full-day tour will include a stop at the Green Spring battlefield site near Jamestown, where Cornwallis defeated patriot forces commanded by Maj. Gen. Marquis de Lafayette and Brig. Gen. "Mad Anthony" Wayne three months prior to Yorktown. The Civil War Trust's new *Campaign 1776* to preserve Revolutionary War battlefields has Green Spring on its endangered list. We will, of course, visit all the major Yorktown battlefield sites: the Fusiliers' Redoubt, the Grand French Redoubt, the American and French Siege Lines, Redoubts Nos. 9 and 10, the Moore House, the Surrender Field and the "Cornwallis Cave." We will also stop at the little-visited British entrenchments at Gloucester Point, across the York River from Yorktown.

Tour Cost: \$145. per person

What's included: motor coach transportation, lunch, beverage and snack breaks, all admissions and gratuities, a map and materials package, and the services of experienced tour guides-historians. Tour goes out rain or shine from the lobby of the Omni Hotel.

### **OPTIONAL FIELD TRIP TWO**

To Appomattox: Post-meeting Bus Tour

Sunday, May 31, 9am-9pm. Leaving from Richmond Omni Hotel

Richmond, VA. Spring, 2015: The perfect opportunity to relive the drama of the last days of the Civil War.

After taking highways from Richmond to Amelia, we'll follow the route of troop movements from Amelia to Appomattox, visit 3 museums, and – on our return trip – experience a proper southern supper at a privately-owned historic plantation. Noted Civil War historian and former Company President, Les Jensen, (Fellow, DSA) will narrate our bus ride highlighting events of the final week of the war.

As we leave Richmond, you'll be issued Confederate rations (water, hardtack and parched corn) for your morning snack. We'll make a brief stop at the Sailor's Creek Visitor Center. Arriving at Appomattox, you will be issued federal rations (box lunch), and we will visit the new facilities of the Museum of the Confederacy at Appomattox. In mid afternoon we will shuttle over to Appomattox Courthouse National Historical Park.

In late afternoon, we'll travel to Haw Branch Plantation for an exclusive event at an extraordinary plantation that remains a private residence. Owner David Cardona will present house tours highlighting artifacts and ephemera related to family members and their service in the House of Burgesses, in every War from the Revolution to the Civil War, service as Secretary of the Navy and Minister to France, and art and artifacts purchased by a family member who served on Perry's expedition to Japan. Sunday Supper (southern style, with 2 starches, 2 vegetables, 2 entrees, and dessert) will be served on the magnificent back porch of the "big house."
