At the Company of Military Historians Annual Meeting at Baltimore, MD on April 21, 2012, the Company announced the Fellows Class of 2012. A member may be named a ***Fellow of the Company of Military Historians*** for outstanding accomplishments in a variety of areas. This honor is reserved for those who have demonstrated noteworthy scholarship and service, both within the Company and in the field of military history in general.

Marc Sammis, curator of the US Army Transportation Museum at Ft. Eustis, Virginia, was recognized as a Fellow for his extensive service to the Company and to the greater military history community.

- He has given extensively of his time through his service on a wide range of committees, both at the national level and in support of the Tidewater Chapter.
- He has contributed many diverse articles to *Military Collector & Historian* concerning twentieth century U.S. Army activities.
- In his positions as curator at the U.S. Army Transportation Museum, as registrar of the National Museum of the U.S. Army, and support of U.S. Army annual museum conferences, he has help educate the public as well as specialists and collectors alike, about twentieth century U.S. Army artifacts and history.
- He has contributed articles to collectors' publications and shared his knowledge with fellow researchers and historians.

His actions both within and outside of the Company of Military Historians and his willingness to share his time and knowledge with others reflects great credit upon Marc Sammis and the Company of Military Historians. Accordingly the Board of Governors recognized Marc Sammis as a Fellow.

Mr. Sammis holds a bachelor's degree from Fairleigh Dickinson University and a master's in history from New York University. He serves as an assistant editor for the Military Collector and Historian, and served for more than 25 years in the US Army and Reserves.
