





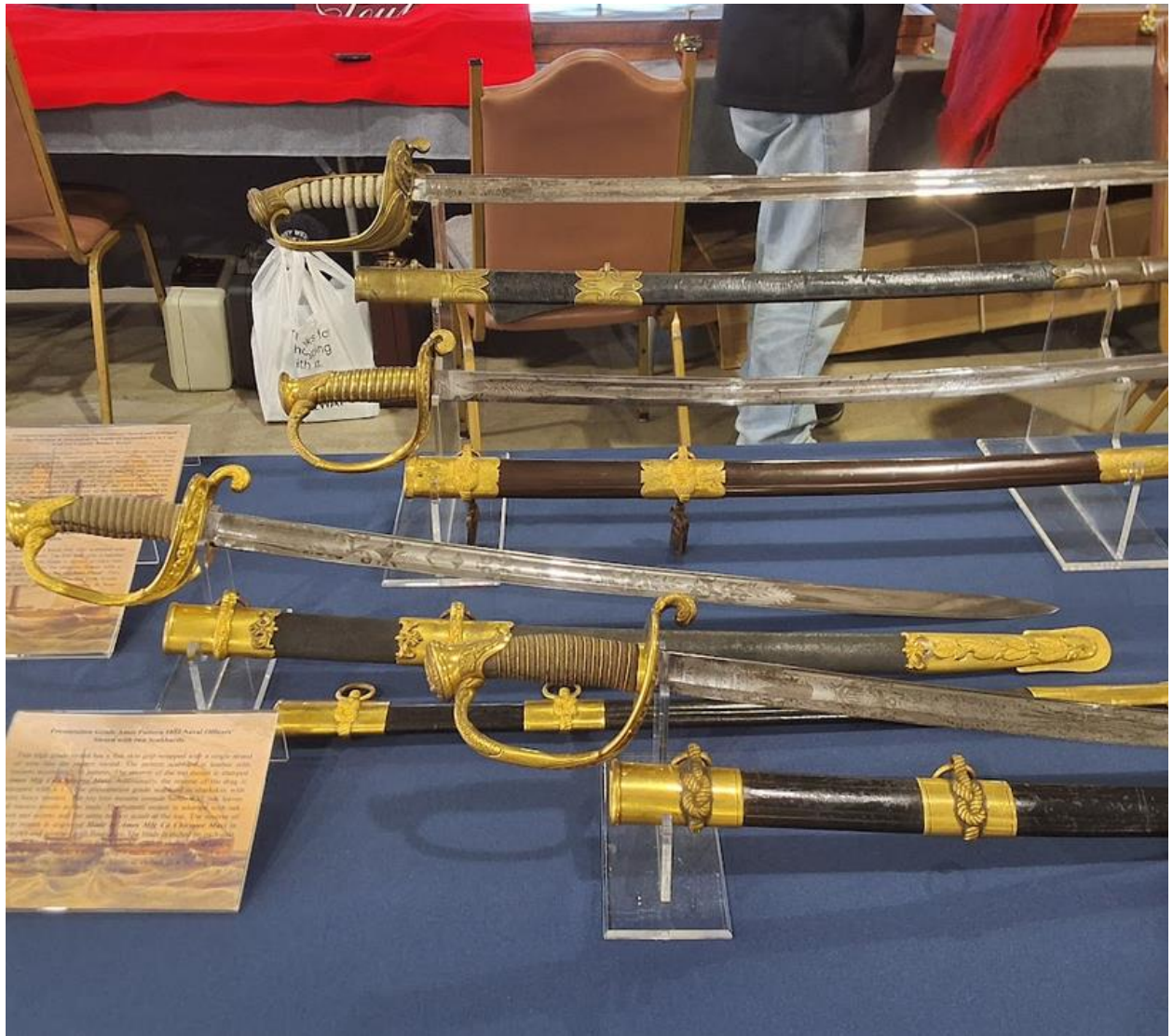

Promotional Sabre, Adam Palfrey 1852 Naval Officer
Awarded with the sword.

This sabre was made in 1852, the year in which Palfrey was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant. It is a fine example of the work of the London Sword Cutlers, who were the leading makers of swords and sabres in the world at that time. The blade is of the best quality and the hilt is of the most elegant design. The sword was presented to Palfrey by the Admiralty as a mark of appreciation for his services during the Crimean War.
